24 Hour urine collection in acid

Introduction

This leaflet explains the procedure for collecting a 24 hour urine sample into a bottle with hydrochloric acid preservative.

What do I need for this test?

You have been provided with:

- 24 hour urine bottle containing 100 mL hydrochloric acid
- Laboratory request form

The urine bottle contains a dilute acid preservative.

- This should not be emptied or washed out
- Skin contact should be avoided
- Always ensure that the lid is put on tightly and keep the container away from children
- Do not pass urine directly into this container

In the event of accidental contact, wash well with water. If irritation persists seek medical advice. If contact with the eye occurs irrigate the area with water and seek medical advice. If swallowed, wash out the mouth thoroughly with water and drink plenty of water.

Seek medical advice and take the container and this notice with you. In case of spillage, mop up carefully wearing rubber gloves.

How do I collect a 24 hour urine?

When you wake up on the day of collection (for example at 7am) pass all urine down the toilet. Do not collect this urine.

Collect all the urine that you pass during the next 24 hours into the container. The following morning (for example at 7am) empty the bladder completely. This urine is also collected into the container.

Cap the container tightly. It is essential that the container is fully labelled. This should include your name, date of birth, and the date and times of the start and end of urine collection.

It is important that all the urine passed during the 24 hours is collected. If you do not collect all the urine the results will not be valid.

Store the bottle in a cool place during the collection.

What do I do with the urine sample?

Return the urine collection to the Pathology laboratory at the Royal Preston Hospital (01772 522607) or Chorley Hospital (01257 245255). Please return the sample on the morning that you complete the collection.

How will I get the result?

The result will be sent to the doctor who asked for you to be tested.
