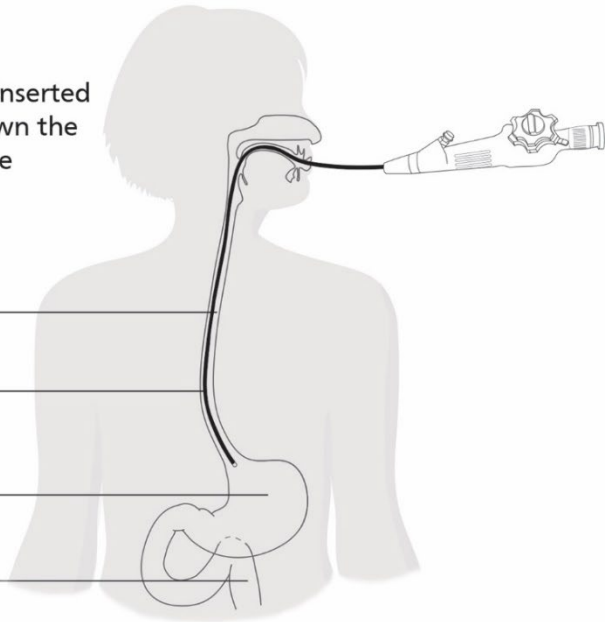
The endoscopic tube is inserted through the mouth, down the oesophagus and into the stomach
