



Discharge Advice

Following an arm, hand or leg nerve block



Division of Surgery - Anaesthesia



Information for patients

Your arm or leg may be numb for up to 24 hours. If your numbness lasts for longer than this, then contact the ward for advice.

While your limb is numb you may not be aware of where it is and there is a risk of it getting damaged. For hand/arm surgery you will be given a sling to keep your arm in until the sensation has returned to normal. This will not prevent you doing your physiotherapy.

You must not attempt to drive.

It is very important to take pain relieving medication when you get home and BEFORE the block wears off. You should start to take your painkillers as soon as a tingling feeling returns to the arm or leg.

General advice

Take Paracetamol 1g (2 x 500mg tablets) 4 - 6 hourly (do not exceed 4g/8 tablets in 24 hours).

You can also take Ibuprofen 400mg 6 hourly if you do not have an intolerance.

In addition, you may be prescribed some stronger opiate-based medication and instructions on how to take these will be given to you on discharge.

You must discuss with the doctor/nurse what pain relieving medication to take if:

- you have any medical conditions (e.g. asthma, stomach ulcers or kidney problems)
- if you are allergic or sensitive to any of the above medication
- If you have any questions or concerns please do not hesitate to ask your anaesthetist or nurses on the ward. After discharge please feel free to contact the ward
