## What is a Haematoma?

A haematoma is a collection of blood which is located outside the blood vessels. They can be found under the skin within a soft tissue and display as a purple coloured bruise. Sometimes, haematomas may not show up as a bruise and can be deeply located. Deeply located haematomas can be felt as a spongey or rubbery lump.

Haematomas are usually caused by an injury to blood vessel walls (such as veins or arteries) which allow the blood to escape and collect together to form a lump.

These usually occur following blunt force injury such as a fall. However, sometimes haematomas can develop without trauma, so-called spontaneous haematomas. Sometimes haematomas are associated with pain / discomfort, but sometimes they cause no symptoms at all (asymptomatic) and simply present as a lump.

### **Investigations and Treatment:**

Most haematomas don't require investigation, as there is usually a defined cause present, for example trauma. However, lumps presenting without an obvious cause will require some further investigations. In this case, haematomas are usually investigated through the use of CT scans and/or MRI scans. Depending on the location of the haematoma, the type of diagnostic imaging needed may differ.

Asymptomatic haematomas can resolve themselves with self-care such as resting, applying an ice pack to the area, compression and elevation.

However, if the haematoma is symptomatic, then surgical drainage may be necessary in order to relieve pressure.

## Follow-up protocol:

Following the diagnosis of a haematoma, you may be asked to come back for follow-up CT scans for monitoring.

Following a surgical procedure, continued observation may be necessary.
