



Discharge Following Rubber Band Ligation for Haemorrhoids



Diagnostic and Clinical Support - Endoscopy



Your haemorrhoids (piles) have been treated by rubber band ligation. This means that a small rubber band has been placed over the base of each pile. The rubber band will cut off the blood supply to the pile. This should then fall off within 5 - 10 days and it will pass when you go to the toilet to open your bowels. You may or may not notice this.

You may see some light bleeding for 4 - 5 days, which is normal. Bleeding risk may increase if you take blood thinning medications (e.g. warfarin, rivaroxaban, apixaban, dabigatran and edoxaban). Your endoscopist may recommend to stop these a few days prior to the procedure.

You may also experience slight discomfort for a few days, and you can take a mild analgesic such as paracetamol (as per instructions) if required. Avoid NSAIDs (e.g. ibuprofen, aspirin, naproxen, diclofenac) as these can increase the risk of bleeding.

During the healing process you should avoid becoming constipated by drinking plenty of water and taking plenty of dietary fibres; this can be done by eating foods such as:

- Wholemeal bread
- Bran
- Fruit
- Vegetables
- Jacket potatoes

If necessary mild laxatives such as Laxido[®] and Fybogel[®] can be used. Use of suppositories should be avoided.

Avoid strenuous activity for 1 - 2 weeks.

In the unlikely event that you have any serious concerns about your health or wellbeing such as:

- Feeling unusually feverish
- Large loss of blood
- Difficulty passing urine
- Swelling of the anus
