How an essential carer can support?

The essential carer/carers will have permission to visit the patient and support with the agreed aspects of fundamental care which could include the following:

- Help with eating and drinking
- Help with personal grooming, shaving, brushing hair, washing face/hands
- Oral care help to brush teeth/ dentures
- Support with changing clothing
- Supplying fresh clothing, and personal hygiene items
- Help the patient take their oral medication
- To prevent deconditioning support the patient in bed/chair exercises and
- mobility as directed by the physio/ occupational therapist assigned to the patient
- Communicating with staff and offering emotional support to the patient
- Support with discharge planning if appropriate

The above are examples of tasks an

essential carer may perform however those tasks completed for the patient while in

hospital must be agreed with the ward manager.

The nominated essential carer/carers must be named when the patient is admitted. We may consider alterations to the nominated essential carer however this must be agreed with the patient and ward manager. We will issue nominated essential carers with a lanyard identification, and ward contact details and this will be documented in the patient's health care record.

The lanyard and identification **must be** returned to the ward manager when the patient is discharged.

The support of an essential carer is believed to have a positive and therapeutic impact on the patients' overall experience whilst in hospital.

Essential carer visits will need to be 'booked/agreed' with the ward in advance.

If the essential carer is intending to stay over night with the patient, the ward can provide folding beds but this must be agreed in advance with the ward manager.
