Adult Audiology Transition

About the department

After your final transition review appointment in the adult service, you will not receive further routine appointments for hearing aid reviews. It is your responsibility to contact us when you have a problem with your hearing or hearing aid/s. If you encounter a problem, contact us as soon as possible. We are based at the Royal Preston Hospital and Chorley and South Ribble District Hospital.

What should I do if I lose my hearing aid?

Take care of your hearing aid/s, if they are lost or damaged you may be charged £75 (exemptions apply, please ask a member of staff). If this does happen, you will need to contact the department to start the process of replacement.

Batteries

Batteries are issued free of charge, to all patients with NHS hearing aids, and are available from the hearing aid department. A 12-month supply is issued. They can be issued out by post if you are unable to attend the department.

Ear moulds

There are standard ear moulds used in adult audiology. The choice is limited to the most appropriate and suitable type of material, not colour or design.

Hearing aid tubing

Your hearing aid tubing will need replacing every 4-6 months. You need to contact us to book an appointment to have your tube replaced or we can offer you a retube kit for you to learn how to do it yourself.

Hearing tests

If you feel your hearing has deteriorated since your hearing aid was issued, please contact us to book an appointment to check the problem is not due to wax or a fault with the hearing aid. Once these problems are ruled out a hearing test can be booked, but there will generally be a waiting list for this.

Sudden hearing loss

If you are concerned about a sudden severe change to your hearing it would be best to visit your GP or Accident and Emergency for medical assessment.

Wax build-up

If you feel you may have a build-up of wax in your ears, olive oil ear drops are recommended to help remove wax if there are no signs of ear infections or perforations. Dewax appointments cannot be arranged via the adult audiology service. Dewax appointments can be arranged by contacting your GP who will refer you to a local service within your GP practice or to Ear Nose and Throat services (ENT).

Common problems and their solutions

Symptom	Possible cause	Solution
No Sound	Worn-out battery Blocked tube (wax/condensation)	Change battery Clean tube
	Blocked tube (wax/condensation)	Clean tube
	Worn-out battery	Change battery
Intermittent or reduced sound	Build-up of wax in ear canal	Have ear checked by GP
Whistling/ Squealing noise whilst in ear	Earpiece not inserted correctly	Reinsert hearing aid
	Build-up of wax in ear canal	Have ear checked by GP
	Tubing split	Make appointment for replacement tubing

If none of the above solutions solves the problem, please contact the department for assistance.
