You are being discharged via "Home to assess"

You are well enough to be discharged from hospital. Staying in hospital longer than you need is not good for your health and we are sure you would prefer to be in the comfort of your own home.

'Home to assess' means just that; getting you home when you are medically well enough to leave hospital.

Where required, formal care will be in place and reviewed by social services shortly after your discharge from hospital, this is usually within 72 hours.

The care you receive when you first go home will have been agreed with you in advance, this may include formal carer visits or support from the take home and settle service.

During the review, further assessment will be completed. Once your assessment is complete, the social care colleague will talk through your needs and agree with you any ongoing plans and options of support.

Things you need to know

If you are at home and experience difficulty in managing or have concerns around your social care needs then please call 0300 123 6720. If you have concerns around your recovery or health please contact your GP or NHS 111.

Do I have to pay?

There is no cost to you for the "home to assess service". Any costs associated with your ongoing needs will be discussed with you during the review/assessment.
