Full Bladder for Patients
Aged 0-16 years**

What is an ultrasound scan?

An ultrasound examination is a method of studying the soft tissue of various parts of the body. Sound waves (which cannot be heard by human ear) are used to produce images. A special gel is applied to your skin, and the ultrasound probe is moved over your skin, this builds up a picture which is displayed on a TV monitor.

Why does my child need an ultrasound scan?

Your child will have been referred by the GP or the paediatrician to assess your child's abdomen/tummy to provide information to plan any possible future treatments.

Important Information

If your child has special needs that you would like to discuss with us, please phone using the numbers overleaf.

We want your child to feel as happy and comfortable as possible with the scan, if they want to bring a toy, or watch their favourite cartoon on their parent's 'phone during the scan, they are more than welcome.

Preparation for the scan

If your child is potty/toilet trained and able to hold a full bladder, it is important to drink water 30 minutes before the scan and not empty the bladder until after the scan.

Your child can eat as normal.

Age 3-5 years	Drink 1 glass of water
Age 6-8 years	Drink 2 glasses of water
Age 9-10 years	Drink 3 glasses of water
Age 11-12 years	Drink 4 glasses of water
Age 13-16 years	Drink 6 glasses of water



Who can accompany my child to the scan?

Under 16 year olds must be accompanied by a parent/guardian/carer.

What happens during the scan?

Please try not to be anxious about the scan. The sonographer or doctor will discuss the procedure with you and adapt the procedure according to your child's needs.

Are there any risks?

There are no known risks.

The results

The results of your scan will be sent to the doctor who requested the scan. You will get the results from this doctor.

Car parking

A pay and display carpark is in operation. Charges apply for both visitors and staff. If your appointment is at the main hospital, you will be charged for parking. At times it can get very busy, please allow time to park prior to your scan. Disabled parking is available on site.
