FAQs

What if I need to be seen urgently?

If you feel that you need to be seen urgently, please call the department and talk to our team. We may need to pass a message to the clinical team. If the clinical team decide that they do need to see you, an appointment will be made for you.

Will I still have regular appointments?

No. This pathway means that we are not planning to see you routinely unless **you** decide you need to be seen. We are confident that you know enough about your condition to know when you need to be seen.

Does this mean that I will not see my usual clinician?

This depends on which specialty you are being seen by. If you have a preference, ask when you contact us and we will try to accommodate this.
